Another Boynton Beach high school senior will be getting a \$1,000 scholarship from the Boynton Woman's Club.


At its executive board meeting in early May and after the other five recipients were announced, Sebastien Edmond of Boynton Beach Community High School was selected to be this year's sixth recipient.



No one paid any attention to the white haired woman standing alone in the middle of the lobby. I really can't describe the feeling; it was weird. I felt as if I was having an out-of-body experience. Recalling the many friends, some whom I still keep in touch with, the many adventures I had while traveling the country with my job. Loves, loses... I was back there again.

Then the gentleman at the desk asked if he could help me. I told him I was just visiting and reviving old memories as I was one of the first tenants to move in the building. We spoke for a while, he gave me a brochure and I suddenly realized my grandson was patiently waiting for me in the car.
